## **PARISH COUNCIL**

### **Quarterly Report (March 2021 – May 2021)**

The long-awaited defibrillator for East Nynehead has finally been purchased and installed on the external wall of Langham House in the centre of this part of the village. Covid restrictions and the procurement of sufficient funding accounted for frustrating delays, but the appliance is now in place, looking splendid and is ready for use. All residents of East Nynehead have been sent details and links to videos explaining how to deploy the defibrillator and a face-to-face training session will be organised for all when it is safe to do so.

The matter of light pollution has also been a recent area of focus for the Parish Council concentrating on the Poole and Westpark Industrial Estates. The Parish Council has now persuaded Viridor to install movement activity sensors on their lights at the Poole Waste Disposal Centre and they have also agreed to switch off others that are not needed at night which has resulted in a significant reduction of light pollution from that site. Deane DLO has also agreed to switch their flood lights to motion sensors on the Westpark site. However, they still need to angle their floodlights downwards as per the correctly configured streetlights in the area, to avoid residual light pollution in the night sky. Other units will now be approached by the Parish Council on both sites and encouraged to follow the good example set by these two companies.

The Nynehead website, for which the Parish Council is responsible, is under review. To comply with legislation introduced last autumn, improvements need to be made, both in terms of design and compliance for the visually impaired. A Website Accessibility Practitioner will conduct an audit of Nynehead's website, to understand the scale of the problem and discussions will then ensue as to how best to proceed with regard to the future size and design of the website and the web provider that would best suit this purpose.

In April, the rearranged second site visit with Kate Brown from SCC Traffic Management took place. Discussions were productive and proposals for the introduction of speed restrictions in the lanes approaching Nynehead and East Nynehead were refined. These are now being reviewed by SCC and a decision is awaited as to whether the collection of speed data will be necessary before the plans can be approved and the procedure started. Two wheeled means of transport was prioritised a few weeks ago at the bike marking event

and registration to the National Bike Register, organised by the Avon and Somerset police at the Memorial Hall. With the help of the sunny weather and a good number of passing cyclists, the event was a big success with around 40 bikes being registered. Our local Police Community Support Officer, Vicky Henderson is always keen to meet local residents and her next beat surgeries will take place at the Memorial Hall on the 24th June, the 22nd July and the 19th August from 2.00 to 3.00 pm. Further details are available on the village noticeboards.

Earlier in the quarter, Mr J Hosking gave a very interesting presentation to the Parish Council on Environmental Opportunities in the area and Community Benefit Societies providing a wealth of examples and ideas for consideration. The Council is now assembling these, and other suggestions proposed by residents, into a collection of possible short-, medium- and long-term future initiatives for the village that will be presented and discussed at the **Annual Parish Meeting on Monday 19th July 2021**. Covid restrictions prevented this event from taking place last year but by July this year, it is hoped that there will be no constraints and that residents will enjoy the opportunity to gather socially, share refreshments and ideas and, most importantly, indicate views and preferences. The Council will then know which projects are most supported and pursue these accordingly. Any additional ideas for consideration are very welcome. ### **RECYCLE MORE**

Somerset Waste Partnership plans to launch its new Recycle More service to all homes in the former Taunton Deane area in the autumn.

You will need to sort recycling into different containers including a new blue bag which will be delivered just before the new service starts. Recycling more every week means far less rubbish which will now be collected every three weeks.

You will be written to twice before any changes – six weeks and three weeks before the service starts – with more details including a 'what goes where' guide.

### **THE SOMERSET WEST & TAUNTON DIABETES PREVENTION PROGRAMME**

A record number of people in the UK are living with Type 2 diabetes. This figure has more than doubled since 1996. Sadly, many people will experience potentially preventable complications because of diabetes, simply because they don't know enough about their condition and how to manage it.

#### **Every 2 minutes someone is diagnosed with Type 2 Diabetes**

The good news is if you're at risk of Type 2 diabetes there are lots of small changes you can make to prevent diabetes from developing in the first place. Don't miss out on the opportunity to take the first step towards a healthier future.

The Diabetes Prevention Programme is a free service for people who are at high risk of developing Type 2 diabetes. It is a behaviour change programme where people learn about diet, physical activity, and strategies to improve their overall health, all aimed at reducing their risk of developing Type 2 Diabetes.

Normally, people access the programme through their GP; however, due to the pandemic and the subsequent pressure that GP practices are facing, a self-referral option has been enabled via the Diabetes UK 'Know Your Risk Score' – a check list of questions that can determine a person's risk factors - This has also enabled the programme to become more accessible to people within the area.

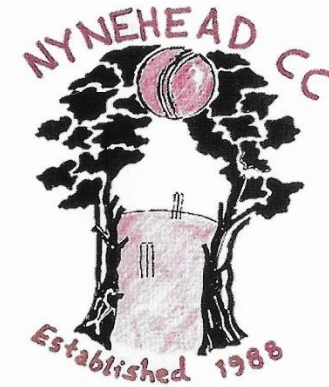
